

Green Badger is used by 80% of the Top 25 Green General Contractors.


Recent Impact

2024 was a year of constant growth – personally, professionally and with our partners and clients.



Construction teams relied on Green Badger for more than 500 projects in 2024 while overall users increased 20% topping 11,000 worldwide. Our team delivered presentations across the country at important industry conferences, hosted more free educational webinars, and delivered more than 4,600 copies of our helpful e-resources.








Our Footprint

Green Badger continuously works to track, benchmark and reduce our environmental footprint and report our Scope 1, 2, and 3 carbon emissions. Since all employees are remote, Green Badger tallied the entire team's total household energy use (not just office/work areas, thereby slightly overstating totals) and offset 100% of all estimated emissions. In fact, this year in our goal to be carbon-positive, Green Badger offset 120% of our calculated emissions in 2024.



Carbon Offset

- Virtual working & eliminating commute
- Employee energy usage
- Carbon offset for flights
- Offset AWS hosting emissions

In all, Green Badger offset 50 tons of eCO2 covering electricity, natural gas, business travel, and our AWS hosting emissions through our partnership with Carbon Solutions Group.



Sustainability Committee

With company support, the entire Green Badger team drives sustainability at home and in their communities.

In 2024, we took bigger steps toward sustainability by switching to recycled paper for all printed materials and adding the recycle symbol to every new item. To cut energy use, we helped employees transition to LED lighting at home, reducing energy consumption and waste.

Education remained a priority, with employees participating in lunch and learns on sustainability topics like fast fashion's impact, the benefits of minimalism, and SITES—a program promoting sustainable landscapes and nature-based solutions.

We were also proud to receive our first Just label—a program that supports organizations in improving employee experience, health, well-being, and community connections, recognizing that people are at the heart of creating a Living Future.



Healthy living was also on the menu—we created a 40-page cookbook full of nutritious recipes for employees and made a bigger effort to celebrate milestones and successes throughout the year. Plus, we embraced a new wellness topic each month to support overall well-being.

From the workplace to home life, Green Badger continues to champion sustainability, wellness, and a greener future.

JUST Label

In September 2024, Green Badger became the first Construction Tech SaaS Company to receive a Just Label from <u>The International Living Future Institute</u> (ILFI), further validating the company's focus on sustainability for the built environment.

The Just label program is a transparency framework that provides a guide to creating meaningful policies and ensuring those policies turn into actions that generate increasing levels of positive impact over time. It requires measuring and reporting on a range of organization- and employee-related indicators.

Green Badger's Just label includes rankings across six categories and the company received the highest marks available for responsibility in:

- Stewardship: Volunteering
- Diversity & Inclusion: Engagement
- Equity: Full-time employment | Pay Scale Equity
- Employee Health: Physical Health | Well Being




Mission & Goals

- Train women+, including women-identified, trans, non-binary, and other underrepresented people, for careers in construction




